How to Enter

- 1 **EXHIBITOR'S HANDBOOK**—This handbook is published yearly and lists all the different departments that you can enter. At the beginning of each department, you will find the eligibility requirements, entry deadline, and delivery and pick-up information
- 2 **ELIGIBILITY**—Participants in the Napa County Fair must be residents of Napa, Solano, Sonoma, Lake, Marin, or Mendocino Counties.
- 3 **ENTRY FORM**—A separate entry form is required for entries in each different department (example: in Home Arts a separate form is needed for entries in the Clothing, Baked Foods, and Preserved Food Departments.)
- 4 Please fill out your entry form completely, making sure to sign the form and include a phone number and complete address. Enter the Division and Class number you feel is best suited for your item. The Fair will attempt to enter exhibits in the proper classes when entries are made in error on the forms, however, the Fair will not be responsible for entries made in error.

- 5 **ENTRY DEADLINE**—ENTRY DEADLINE FOR ALL DEPARTMENTS IS JUNE 15, 2009
- 6 **DELIVERY OF ENTRIES**—Bring your items to the specific building on the Fairgrounds listed in the Information for each Department. Bring your items between the hours listed.
- 7 **JUDGING**—Exhibits will be judged on the specific date indicated in the Department Information.
- 8 **AWARDS**—Results from the judging will be processed and checks issued to winners in each Class. If time allows, the checks may be presented to participants when their items are picket up. If not available, the checks will be mailed to the address on your entry form.
- 9 **REMOVAL OF ENTRIES**—All items must be picked up on the date listed under Exhibits Released. The Fair will not be responsible for items after July 6th. Any items not picked up by July 6th will become the property of the Napa County Fair. The Fair reserves the right to dispose of such property in any manner it may deem necessary in the best interest of the Fair.

Payment of premiums is subject to the following rules:

State rules, a copy of which are on file in the Fair Office, will be followed, if any occasion arises in which there is no satisfactory solution found in the Local Rules.

- 1 Exhibitors participating in the Napa County Fair, must be residents of Napa, Solano, Sonoma, Lake or Marin Counties.
- 2 Use a separate entry blank for each department in the Home Arts Department. When making entries, please list one class per line, as indicated on the entry blank.
- 3 No exhibits shall be removed prior to 8:00 a.m. Monday, July 6.
Exhibitors are requested to claim their displays between 8:00 a.m. and Noon, July 6. The management will not be responsible for exhibits after that time.
- 4 All Junior Entry Blanks must be signed by Parent or Guardian or by Youth Leader.
- 5 Checks, covering awards in all classes, will be promptly issued.
PREMIUMS ARE PAID ONLY FROM THE RECORDS OF THE JUDGES' SHEETS. All premium checks shall be made payable to the exhibitor in whose name the entry was made **AND ARE VOID AFTER 60 DAYS FROM THE DATE ISSUED.**
- 6 No signs larger than a quarter card may be placed on any exhibit without permission from the department superintendent, nor shall any advertisements be posted on grounds and buildings except at commercial exhibits without permission of the management.
7. The Fair Management and Board of Directors shall not be responsible for accidents or loss that may occur to any of the exhibitors or exhibits at a show and the exhibitors shall hold the management and directors harmless and indemnify them against any legal proceeding arising from such accident or loss.

DEFINITIONS:

1. JUNIOR DEPARTMENT—Exhibitor must not be older than 17 years of age opening day of the fair to be eligible to enter in this department.
2. SENIOR DEPARTMENT—Any department not considered a Junior Dept.
3. CASH AWARD—Monies paid to successful contestants (Same as premiums)
4. DIVISION—A generalized category of exhibits or a group of classes.
5. CLASS—A group of like exhibits that are judged together; a subcategory of a division.
6. ENTRY—An eligible exhibit which is entered and judged.
7. EXHIBIT—An object, animal, or a collection of objects or animals entered in a class. (Synonymous with entry)
8. EXHIBITOR—The owner of the exhibit.
9. JUDGING SYSTEM—**American**—The judging process to rank exhibits against one another and award one first placing, one second placing, etc.
Danish—The judging process to compare each exhibit on its own merit against the recognized standard and award as many firsts etc. as merited.
10. AMATEUR—A person who engages in an event or activity as a pastime rather than a profession. (Does not apply to junior organizations).
11. PROFESSIONAL—A person who engages in an event or activity for monetary profit.
12. **Sweepstakes**—*In specific Flower and Vegetables Division points are accumulated for each 1st, 2nd and 3rd place received by exhibitor. Exhibitor with the highest number of accumulated points, receives the Sweepstakes Award.*

1. NO ENTRY LIMIT
2. Any plant having received a blue ribbon at any previous show shall be entered as a complimentary entry.
3. Exhibitors will be allowed to replenish/water entries from 9:00 to 10:00 a.m. each day of the fair.
4. Vases or other suitable containers must be furnished by the exhibitor.
5. Cactus and succulent gardens must be growing and well established to be eligible for awards.
6. All dahlias, except pompoms, and roses except floribunda, must be disbudded.
7. All containers should be marked for positive identification by the owner, preferable on the bottom.
8. All exhibits will be required to remain in the show and be maintained for the duration of the Fair unless specifically excused by management.
9. The management will furnish security but will not assume liability for loss or damage to exhibits or personal property of the exhibitor.
10. Exhibits must be the work of the exhibitor.
11. The judges will award such premium as exhibits merit. If an item is not judged worthy of a premium, the judges will make no award. Where there is no competition, the decision of the judges in awarding first, second and third premiums, or no award, will be final.

Staging makes for good showmanship. Vases are an improvement in many arrangements. Backgrounds, whenever possible, are an added touch to make arrangements distinctive. When using cloth material for backgrounds, the material must be neat and free of wrinkles.

1. Freedom of creativity in all classes allow the exhibitor greater scope in design, color and material.
2. Materials used in arrangements may be fresh, dried or treated, unless otherwise stated in schedule.
3. NO artificial flowers or foliage to be used.

4. Grapes and fruit can be plastic.
5. Contrived flowers of natural origin may be used to supplement design.
6. Materials used in arrangements must be of lasting quality and maintained by exhibitor for duration of the fair.
7. If mechanics fail, arrangement will not be judged.
8. Flowers and materials used in arrangements need not be grown by exhibitor.
